

RECYCLE PRINTER CARTRIDGES AND MORE TO EARN MONEY FOR YOUR BAND STUDENT'S IMF

Our recycling program has been expanded this year. We are partnering with two companies to boost IMF earning potential.



CARTRIDGES FOR KIDS is a Colorado company. They recycle old video game consoles, video games, used cell phones, digital cameras, laptops, PDAs/Palm Pilots, iPods, DVD movies, GPS systems, ink jet cartridges, and laser jets. CARTRIDGE WORLD is a Tucson based franchise that recycles ink and laser jet cartridges exclusively. We will be recycling all cartridges locally because they reimburse at higher rates than Cartridges For Kids.

HOW YOU CAN PARTICIPATE

Items can be deposited in the collection box located in the band room. Or, if you are recycling ink or laser jet cartridges, they can be delivered directly to one of three Cartridge World locations: Oracle north of Ina, Broadway/Swan or 22nd/Harrison.

To ensure that your submissions are properly credited to your IMF, all items must be securely bagged and clearly marked with your student's full name.

If you choose to deliver your cartridges directly to Cartridge World, all items must be bagged and marked as "RUMBA" in addition to your child's full name.

CARTRIDGE WORLD's price lists will soon be posted on the RUMBA site. Please be aware that Cartridge World's reimbursement rates fluctuate quarterly due to market conditions.

MAXIMIZE your student's earning potential by involving your family and work place.

The collection bin will be emptied twice monthly. Cartridges For Kids issues a check each month for shipments received at their plant by the last day of the prior month.

Cartridge World issues reimbursement checks approximately every other month.

An itemized accounting will be provided to the treasurer by the coordinator in conjunction with the delivery of checks to assure proper credit to IMF accounts.

This is a year-round program. IMF credit for any submission made on or after October 15, 2008 cannot be guaranteed in time for the final Fiesta Bowl trip payment due in December.
